With national attention now focused on violence and guns, and with leaders like President Obama calling upon all of us to realize that we must change that is going on, we have an opportunity to not only implement engaging and rigorous ducational tools, but also to have our youth be leaders in forging the change in thinking and ction needed to move away from violence, toward positive problem solving and conflict esolution. The March 4 <sup>th</sup> event begins an opportunity for us to do our part in contributing ositively to the national conversation, as well as taking effective action in our communities.
